I was offered a position as a Crisis Intervention Specialist, I told them that the title of the position sounded too long for a short person like me, but I accepted.

I didn't have a great deal of experience; however, I did share that I had experienced domestic violence in my personal life, and experienced sexual harassment during my job as a field worker. Working for Monarch was a new experience for me. I began to feel much more confident in my role as an Advocate, and more connected to the community, when I began to facilitate the Spanish support groups. Later, the Crisis Intervention Manager position was vacant and I got the job. I supervised Volunteers, On-Call Advocates, and the full-time Crisis Intervention Specialists. During this time the agency merged with Defensa de Mujeres.

During my time at Monarch, I raised my five children as a single mother. Not only have I grown a great deal in my professional career, but I have also grown in my personal life. I believe that I have been able to use my own experience to reach and help our clients begin to heal from their own trauma.

While the agency has gone through many changes, I have remained committed to helping ALL who come through our doors. Twenty years ago, the agency was run much different, and it is wonderful to see how much we have grown and how much our client systems have changed for the better. Today I work as a Shelter Advocate in addition to working within the On-Call program.

Domestic Violence Statistics

- 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men have been victims of some form of physical violence by an intimate partner within their lifetime.
- Women between the ages of 18-24 are most commonly abused by an intimate partner.
- On average, nearly 20 people per minute are physically abused by an intimate partner in the United States. During one year, this equates to more than 10 million women and men.
