As the impact of the coronavirus (COVID-19) increases globally and locally, Monarch Services recognizes the need to both protect our community and continue holistically serving our clients. To effectively accomplish both goals and in compliance with Santa Cruz County's "shelter in place" <u>order</u>, we will no longer have staff in either of our two offices (Watsonville and Santa Cruz) in attempt to "flatten the curve" and prevent future spread of the coronavirus in our community.

This does not mean we will halt our services, as uncertain times like these can make community members increasingly vulnerable. We will continue to serve our clients via video or phone. We recognize that not every community member has access to these methods of communication and will serve our clients on a case-by-case basis if video or phone communication is not an option. Additionally, our 24-hour confidential, bilingual crisis line (1.888.900.4232) will remain fully staffed and our Mariposa Shelter will continue to house individuals and families fleeing from violence and needing services. Monarch continues to be on the front lines, even through this unprecedented time, and will stand with our community to keep us all safe.
